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Our Safety Mission

As a company providing program and project management services, our employees are rarely exposed firsthand to jobsite hazards for the projects they manage.

However, at OPM we believe it is our responsibility to recognize and mitigate potential risks faced by field staff on jobsites as they execute utility infrastructure projects.

Therefore, our safety program is focused on educating our employees on construction site hazards, equipment, and regulations so that they may partner effectively with jobsite crews on risk identification, material or equipment changes, and timeline alterations as required to keep personnel safe.



Our Approach

Monthly trainings for OPM staff on a variety of safety topics related to the following:

- 1 OSHA regulations and compliance
- 2 Construction site hazard identification
- 3 Weather and environmental hazards
- 4 Equipment and controls
- 5 Employee rights and responsibilities related to jobsite safety
- 6 Safe practices
- 7 First aid
- 8 Natural disaster planning
- 9 Personal protective equipment
- 10 Relevant project risk planning



Staff Roles and Responsibilities

OPM encourages our employees to engage construction managers and field staff in conversation regarding jobsite safety concerns for any issues, including weather, equipment, staffing, environment, or other factors that may impact worker safety.

Our employees are responsible for completing monthly training assignments and advising management if there are additional topics they feel are relevant to the projects they are managing.

All workers have the right to refuse dangerous work under OSHA standard 1977.12. OPM employees understand that no employee who stops work due to what he or she believes are unsafe conditions will suffer retaliation, ridicule, or retribution.

OPM's Safety Manager is BCSP certified as a Safety Trained Supervisor in Construction, ensuring trainings are relevant, thorough, and capable of properly informing office staff on jobsite hazards, controls, regulations, and compliance.
